Estimate of Legal Ability

NOTE—No arbitrary rule for determining legal ability can be formulated. Ratings are based upon the standard of ability for the place where the lawyer practices. Age, practical experience, class of practice, with other necessary qualifications are considered; reports are obtained through various channels and we endeavor to reflect the consensus of reliable opinion.

To qualify for "a", lawyers must be reported "very high" and have been practicing not less than eight to ten years (ten years in large cities). To qualify for "b", lawyers must be reported "high" and have been practicing not less than five years. A lawyer reported "very high" and in practice more than five years but not long enough to qualify for "a" is rated "b".

"a", very high; "b", high; "c", fair; "d", medium; "e", neither rated nor recommended.

Recommendations

NOTE—Nothing derogatory to moral character should be inferred from these ratings without special information to that effect.

Ratings are indicated by the letters "v", "w", "x", "y", grading from "v", which means "very high", and "z" which means, "neither rated nor recommended".

Estimated Worth

NOTE—It is often difficult to get reliable estimates, therefore the ratings given must be considered as being conservative approximations only.

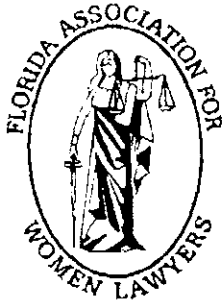

Susan E. Ervin of St. Petersburg passed the bar examination administered by the State Board of Law Examiners and was admitted to practice law in Florida on July 26, 1927. She was an associate in the St. Petersburg law firm of Spear, Viney, Skelton & Pearce. The law firm had a general civil practice in all courts and specialized in real estate, land title, and probate matters. It represented Alexander National Bank in liquidation and was the approved counsel for New York Title & Mortgage Co.

Two Pensacola Navy Fliers Killed

Officer Married Last Friday Dies in Crash

PENSACOLA — (AP) — Naval officers expressed the opinion the cause would ever be known after a seaplane crash yesterday in which a naval officer died on his first flight since his marriage six days ago and a student flier were killed.

The victims names were given as (J. G.) Joseph S. Fox, of Seattle, Wash., flight instructor, and Alfred Peter Ivy, of Norfolk, Va., aviation-maintenance mate and a student flier at the naval air station.

A board of inquiry began an investigation but officers said it would be at least two days before it would be completed. When, they said, it was completed that much light could be thrown on the accident because there were no actual eye-witnesses.

Cornelius Lafferty, a machinist's mate undergoing flight training, was flying solo but did not see the mixer until the plane had struck the water. Lafferty landed the plane and dived overboard to

BASED ON POPULATION

The 1935 amendment bases the number of judges in each judicial district throughout the state on the population, with one judge to each 50,000 inhabitants.

As the population count is based on either a state or federal census, there can be no change in the local situation until after the 1940 federal census is taken.

A plan was on foot to provide for a special census in the sixth district—Pinellas and Pasco counties—by legislative act. This, however, has not materialized.

Owing to the large volume of divorce cases and extra court work during the winter season, local attorneys are generally agreed that at least three judges are required to handle the work and that during part of the year four judges could be kept busy.
